UZBEKISTAN'S WATER CHALLENGE: REALITIES AND PROSPECTS



The New Uzbekistan Strategy 2022–2026 provides for:

- Saving at least 7 billion cubic metres of water
- Reducing energy consumption at water facilities
- Introducing public-private partnership (PPP) mechanisms in sector management

Context:

Recognising the growing shortage of water resources, Uzbekistan is taking active steps to ensure their rational use: modernising water supply and irrigation systems, advancing water treatment technologies, and implementing projects to reduce losses and boost agricultural productivity. Yet water security in Central Asia cannot be achieved by one country alone. Uzbekistan underscores the need for joint regional solutions, knowledge sharing, and coordinated action among governments, businesses, and international organisations.

The National Programme for 2025–2028 includes:

- Reconstruction of 2,551 km of irrigation networks
- Introduction of water-saving technologies on 1.4 million hectares
- Automation of 18,755 water control structures
